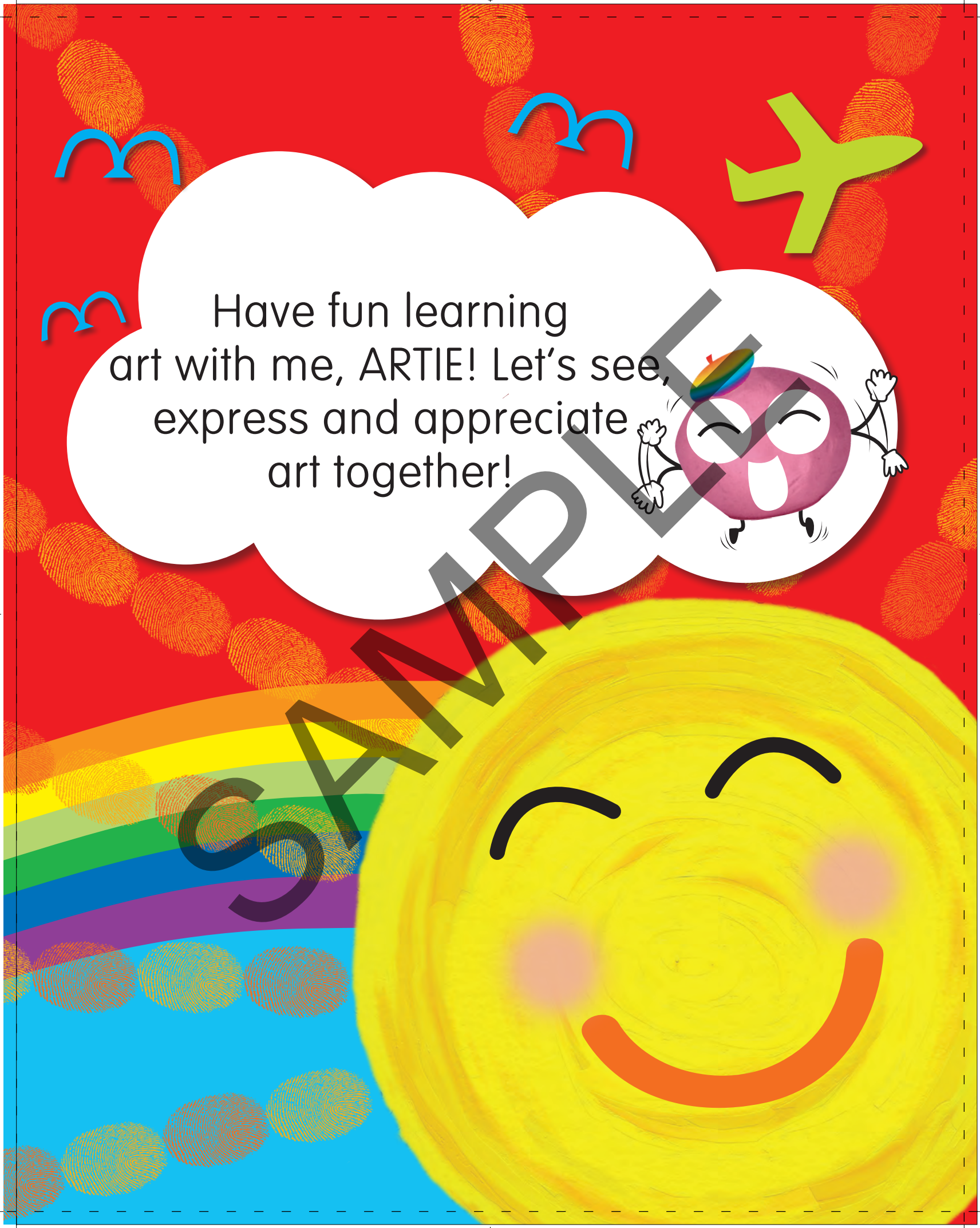


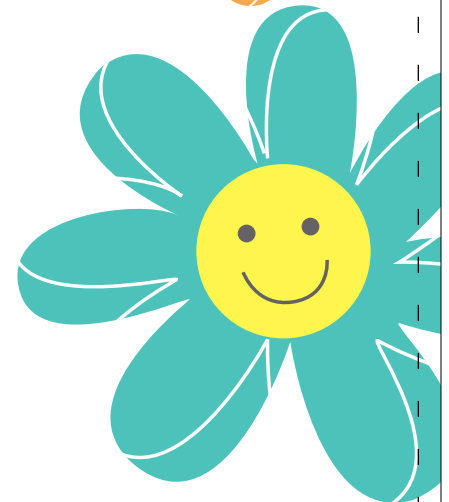

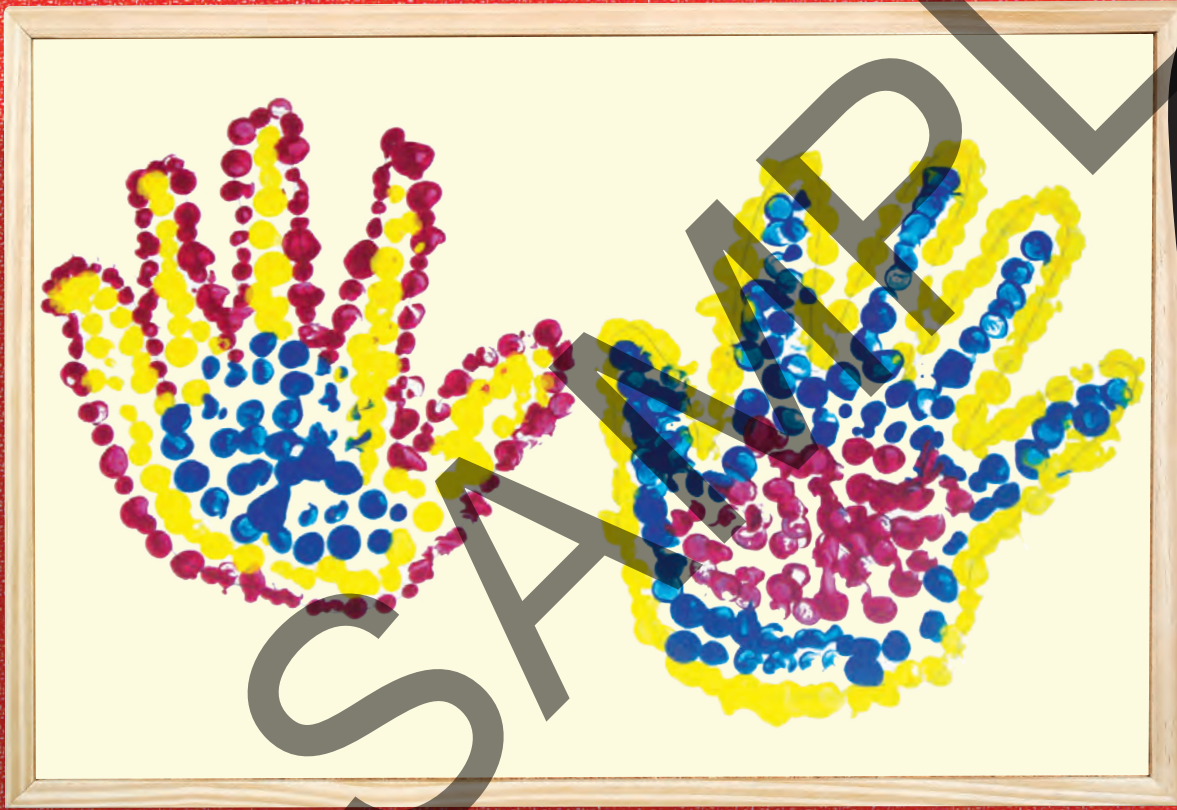

As we can see, dots can be arranged to form lines.



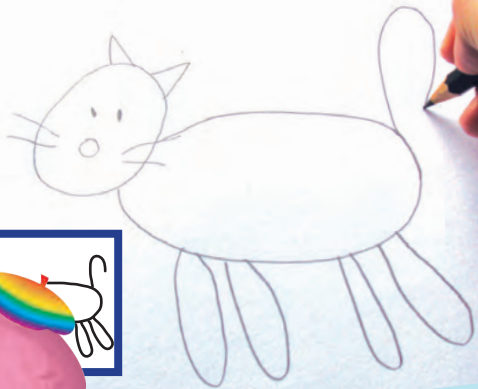
Now, let's create an artwork with dots!

Things You Need

- Drawing paper
- Pencil and eraser
- Poster paints
- Palette
- Newspaper
- Cup of water
- Rag

Draw your favourite animal lightly in pencil.

Squeeze paint onto the palette. Dip a finger in the paint and make dots along the lines.

Finish the outline. Use a different colour paint to dot the spaces inside.

Ask an adult to make you a trash bag apron like this. It will help keep your uniform clean!

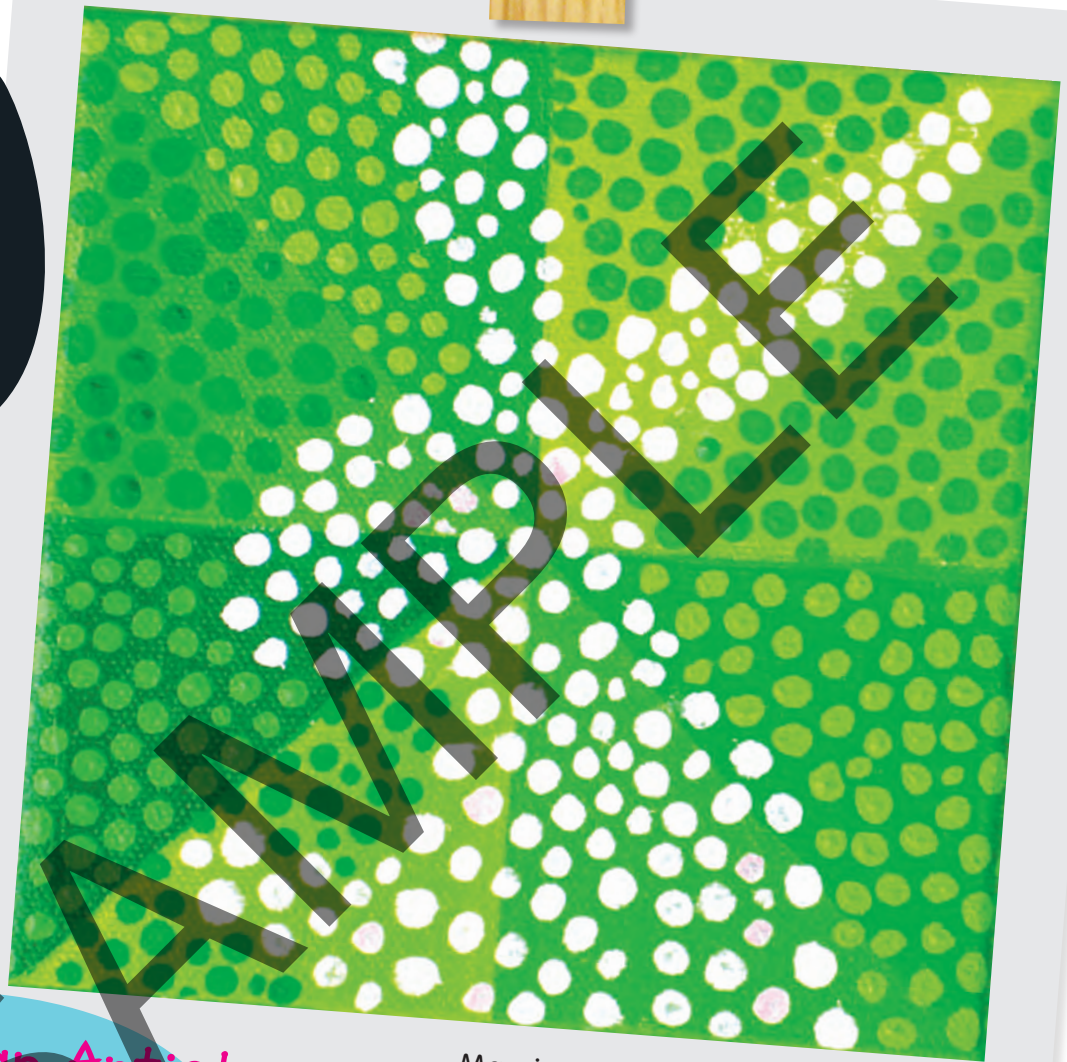
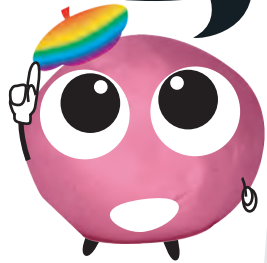
